Super: Compete With Integrity

The following story is purely fictitious

Voice-over: Our new contract negotiation with SFG is under way.

But they request for an additional clause on tying

stipulating that if we want to buy the medical device that only SFG makes, we must buy other medical supplies from them as well.

Voice-over: That will include medical masks, gloves, syringes etc.

device, forcing us to order other products from them.

That leaves us no choice at all.
